Hear the Cannon sound, Recalling the defense of little Egg Harbor during the American Revolution!

Starting at 10:00 a.m. Saturday, October 15th, 2022 at the Pulaski Monument adjacent to 800 block of Radio Rd., Little Egg Harbor

Invade Little Egg Harbor! (*they did*)

When: Oct. 15 10 a.m. - 12:30 p.m. public Meet and Greet History discussion, Education program & replica Cannon demonstration; 1 p.m. Solemn ceremony for the Fallen

Where: Pulaski Monument (See directions below)

What: The West Jersey Artillery (a safety-certified historical reenactment unit) arrives to give a show recalling Pulaski's defense of Little Egg Harbor in the American Revolution. Actually, the 'cannon- discharging' starting around 10 o'clock in the morning of Saturday, October 15th 2022 commemorates Brigadier General (the Count) Casimir Pulaski's signaling of the commencement of the battle in 1778 on the same exact date! Back in the Revolution, with the report of the artillery sounding at Daybreak the die was cast in history – Pulaski would unleash his cavalry to eject the British in their invasion of Little Egg Harbor. Join us for a commemoration of the epic event including this noise-making, but 'non-firing' Cannon.



West Jersey Artillery (WJA)

The British Invasion threatened the port of Little Egg Harbor and Maybe the American Cause itself. *The Pulaski Monument marks the spot where a strong British amphibious force landing from ships in Little Egg Harbor was repulsed in a campaign known as the Defense of Little Harbor. The Oct. 15 battle actually marked the second time in 9 days the enemy retreated in front of Pulaski Legion cavalry.* But the Bigger Historical story of Little Egg Harbor in the Revolution is just emerging. Join us to learn and find out just how big it gets. AEHHS will have available for viewing the first 3 installments of our new 250th Anniversary of the American Revolution poster series. It represents the newest 250 year-old information we have! For the record, this year marks the two-hundred forty-fourth year since the battle of October 15, 1778.

Directions: From N.J. Garden State Parkway, take Exit 58 (Route 539) toward Tuckerton [3.3 miles] to Route 9. In Tuckerton, turn RIGHT onto Route 9; proceed one block to traffic light at Great Bay Blvd. Turn LEFT onto Great Bay Blvd and proceed one-third mile and turn RIGHT onto Radio Road. Proceed 2.25 miles down Radio Road, passing through the intersection of Harbortown Blvd/Mathistown Rd (traffic light). The Pulaski Monument is on the LEFT, just past the fire station.
