Ms. Pat Johnson from the Sandpaper: Asked for additional information and changes that have occurred with Resolution 2021-262 and Resolution 2021-272 pertaining to Mr. Rodney Haines and his agreements with Ocean Township.

Interim Business Administrator/CFO, Rodney Haines stated he is working on an "as needed" basis with Ocean Township.

Ms. Pat Johnson from the Sandpaper: Asked how much the Township is receiving from Ocean Township for his services.

Interim Business Administrator/CFO, Rodney Haines stated Ocean Township is paying a 2% increase over the original amount of \$61,200 annually, of which a stipend of \$36,720 annually is provided to Mr. Haines and the Township receives the remaining amount annually.

Ms. Pat Johnson from the Sandpaper: Asked about Resolution 2021-263 Clean Energy Smartstart Program and if it pertains to electric vehicles.

Mayor John Kehm stated the program pertains to LED street lighting within the Township.

Township Engineer Jason Worth provided additional information on the program stating that 1450 street lights will be converted from high pressure sodium bulbs to LED lights throughout the Township.

Interim Business Administrator/CFO, Rodney Haines stated the grant was awarded over a year ago and the approval of the Resolution allows for the Township to spend the funds.

Ms. Pat Johnson from the Sandpaper: Asked who was doing the work and how much the Township will receive for converting the lights.

Interim Business Administrator/CFO, Rodney Haines stated Atlantic City Electric will be doing the work and converting to the LED's will save the Township over \$50,000 a year.

Ms. Pat Johnson from the Sandpaper: Asked for additional information on the retiree's departments, compensation and accumulated time received on Resolution 2021-270 and Resolution 2021-271.

Interim Business Administrator/CFO, Rodney Haines explained details for the two retiring employees, their time working for the Township, what department they worked for and the amount of compensation they will be receiving.

Ms. Pat Johnson from the Sandpaper: Asked about Resolution 2021-274 and the contract.

Interim Business Administrator/CFO, Rodney Haines stated the contract is for Administrative Support Staff and it is a three year contract with 2/2/0% increases. He also stated the additional contract details will be available after the meeting.

Mr. Art Mooney of Windstar Drive: Asked if the street lighting grant covers all the lights within Little Egg Harbor Township.

Township Engineer Jason Worth stated it is not for all street lights but does include roads that are State Highways, County Roads and Township Roads. He further stated that the lights that are being converted are within Little Egg Harbor Township and the oldest lights in the Township will be replaced.

Mr. Art Mooney of Windstar Drive: Asked about the American Rescue Plan, the food pantry relocation, the damaged bus shelter and thanked Mrs. Crea for her work with the senior community and wished her all the best on her next chapter. He further thanked Ms. Stevens for her work with the Veterans and wished her the best.

Mayor John Kehm stated the money usage has not been determined regarding the American Rescue Plan but decisions will be made early 2022 when the new members have taken office and their ideas can be included. He stated he believes the food pantry cannot be relocated since it is funded through CDBG money but is still awaiting additional information.

Interim Business Administrator/CFO, Rodney Haines stated he is still awaiting written information from the church.

Deputy Mayor Blaise Scibetta stated he tasked himself during the NJLOM Conference to speak to officials regarding the bus shelters and get further information and contacts pertaining to the matter. He stated he spoke to a woman from NJ Transit and he provided her with the details of what occurred to the damaged Township bus shelter. NJ Transit relayed to Mr. Scibetta that they are unable to provide the Township with a replacement bus shelter and there are no grants or funding available for a new one.

Deputy Mayor Scibetta stated the next step is to replace the bus shelter with next year's budget and possibly recoup the money through local business advertising on the shelter itself.

Interim Business Administrator/CFO, Rodney Haines stated NJ Transit provided the first bus shelter and all upkeep and maintenance thereafter is done by the Sponsor, which is the Township. The cost for a replacement bus shelter is between \$6,000 and \$10,000. He further stated for the future all bus shelters are on the Township Insurance Policy.

BEST PRACTICES

Interim Business Administrator/CFO, Rodney Haines stated every year the state of New Jersey requires the Township to fill out the best practices checklist which he has completed and the inventory in accordance with the guidelines. He stated the Township scored 20.5 and the state aid will not get reduced because it was above 15. He also stated no vote is required and the checklist will be provided on the website.

TOWNSHIP ENGINEER

Jason Worth gave updates on the active projects within the Township. He stated the improvements made to Tradewinds Drive and Seabreeze Drive are wrapping up and all that remains is restoration and top paving, which should be completed by next week. He stated the dredging for the Mystic Island Phase II Project is finishing up and all should be finished by next week. He stated the dredging for Atlantis is finally underway and will be working there for the next seven weeks then moving over to Mystic Island after that. He lastly stated that the reconstruction of the football and soccer fields is underway and the drainage work has been completed and the sod replacement will be done in the spring. He also wished everyone Happy Holidays with their families.

TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE COMMENTS

Mayor Kehm presented Committee Member Stevens with a bouquet of flowers for her service and a job well done. He wished her well and appreciated all she has done for the Township.

Committee Member Stevens thanked everyone for the generous gift and for the enjoyment she has had working for the Township. She further stated she will be going into retirement for a while but will eventually work with the Polasky Monument to provide residents with the knowledge and history held within Little Egg Harbor Township. Lastly, she stated it was truly an honor and privilege serving the Township and wished Mr. Maxwell all the best as the next Committee Member.

Committee Member Crea thanked Ms. Stevens for being such a good companion and friend through the years and wished her all the best of luck. Mrs. Crea wished everyone from her family to theirs a Merry Christmas and Happy Holiday.

Committee Member Scibetta reiterated what Mr. Money previously stated about the Veterans and thanked Ms. Stevens for all hard work she did during Hurricane Sandy and working for the veterans. He again stated he attended the NJLOM Conference and was provided with a wealth of information

pertaining to Sustainable Jersey, BPU, NJ Transit and several other seminars pertaining to programs that the Township is hopefully able to utilize to help the residents. Lastly, he stated he hopes at the next Committee Meeting there will be a Resolution opposing the Governor Murphy's toll increases on the NJ Parkway and Turnpike. He wished everyone a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year and is looking forward to seeing everyone at the Reorganizational Meeting on January 1, 2021.

Mayor Kehm stated a decision will be made by tomorrow regarding the December 11, 2021 Santa and Mrs. Claus event at the community center due to weather.
