  [The township desires to make application to the LFB for its review and approval of a waiver of a down payment for the mechanical maintenance dredging in the Mystic Island (West Phase I) section

2021-114	Authorizing use of Township property for Atlantic City Regional Stand Down for Veterans: Mobile on May 28, 2021 [The governing body grants permission to the Wilmington VA Medical Center to hold an event in the outside area of 7 Gifford Road to reach veterans who may need assistance.]
2021-115	Authorizing the purchase of a 2022 Ford F350 4WD pickup truck under State Contact #A88758, T2101 [The total amount of the truck is not to exceed \$40,614.00.]
2021-116	Supporting Pinelands Municipal Council Resolution 2020-01 opposing State of New Jersey cut of PILOT payments under the Garden State Preservation Trust Act after municipal tax rates have been set [Cutting the PILOT payment under the Garden State Preservation Trust Act is an approximate loss of \$80,907.00 to Little Egg Harbor and the cutting of the funding after the setting of the tax rate is contrary, unlawful and inequitable and should be reversed.]
2021-117	Requesting the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities reject New Jersey Natural Gas Company's petition for a 25% customer rate increase [New Jersey Natural Gas Company has petitioned the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities for a 25 percent customer rate increase.]
2021-118	Strongly urging Governor Murphy to eliminate outdoor gathering limits for school graduation ceremonies [Outdoor gatherings still have limits that will restrict graduation ceremonies.]

# PUBLIC COMMENT - Consent Agenda Only

Motion to Open: Stevens Second: Gormley All in Favor Ms. Pat Johnson: With regard to the budget, she asked if it increases the tax rate and if so, how much.

CFO Rodney Haines stated the \$24,479,062.03 is an increase to the tax levy and the total tax levy will be \$19,378,350.09 which will be a tax increase of 2.9 cents on the tax rate which he explained.

Ms. Pat Johnson: Asked what the increase will be for an average home.

CFO Rodney Haines explained for a \$200,000 property it would be about \$58.00 in a year. The tax rate will be 83 cents.

Ms. Pat Johnson: Asked for details on the agreement with the white collar workers.

CFO Rodney Haines explained on average it comes out to approximately a 2% increase.

Ms. Pat Johnson: Asked how much the township will receive for the lease with CTI Towers Assets II, LLC.

CFO Rodney Haines asked Ms. Johnson to reach out to him and he will give her the information. He gave a brief review of the terms.

Mr. Art Mooney: Asked if there will be an in person budget meeting this year.

CFO Rodney Haines explained we are required to hold a public hearing at the next meeting prior to adopting the budget.

Mayor Kehm stated the meeting in June will be in person at 7:30pm.

Mr. Art Mooney: Asked for the approximate percentage of increase on the budget.

CFO Rodney Haines explained the increase on the tax levy itself is 2.9 cents which equates to a 3.6% increase.

Mr. Art Mooney: Asked if the payout on the Super Storm Sandy cleanup is incorporated in that amount.

CFO Rodney Haines explained that is still out there.

Mayor Kehm stated that is not included and we are hoping to work with Congressman Van Drew on the matter.

CFO Rodney Haines stated the loan will be due in 2023 and at that point we will renegotiate the loan and extend it for five more years which he explained.

Mr. Art Mooney: Believes the town is expecting about two million dollars in municipal stimulus and asked if that is incorporated in the budget.

CFO Rodney Haines stated none of those funds are incorporated into this budget which he discussed.

Mr. Art Mooney: Spoke about the Cannabis Regulatory Enforcement Assistance and Marketplace Modernization Act.

Ms. Kate Goode: With regard to Resolution 2021-90, authorizing curbside collection of solid waste for Harbourtown Villas, she asked if it will be amended to drop the curbside reference.

Township Attorney Melanie Appleby explained the language in that resolution is terminology consistent with the statute however it will not affect what will occur in that community.

Ms. Kate Goode: Spoke about the success of Earth Day in the Township. mentioned the various ordinances regarding litter and who enforces them, including the issue with the delivery of the local paper.

Mayor Kehm explained the process for eliminating the delivery of the weekly paper and the responsibility of the Code Enforcement Officer.

Township Attorney Melanie Appleby stated with regard to the delivery of the weekly paper, you cannot ban its distribution however you can sign up to stop delivery at an individual's property.

Committeewoman Lisa Stevens explained the process of opting out of the paper delivery through the Township Clerk's office.

Ms. Jodi Stewart: Explained she is working with the congressional members and they are trying to get the CDL loans forgiven which she discussed.

Mr. John Edmunds: Mentioned he does not see a change in the Little Egg Harbor section of Center Street.

Township Administrator Rodney Haines stated he will speak with the Police Department tomorrow to get an update.

Committeewoman Lisa Stevens has been involved with the issues on Center Street and will continue to work with the Police Department on it.
