TOWNSHIP ENGINEER COMMENTS

Township Engineer, Jason Worth, reported, as per the Consent Agenda, the Schedule C paving list will be sent to the County and soon they will be coordinating the annual meeting with the County Engineer and County Commissioner to discuss Township and County projects for 2023. He stated the Community Center projects are underway with the skate park nearing completion. Mr. Worth met with the JIF representative this past week and they approved the skate park as is pending signage, grading, drainage and additional paving. He stated the basketball and pickleball courts will be completed by the spring, as weather permits, paving will occur with color coding, sealing and stripping. He stated this week he is coordinating with the fire department a suitable location for the helipad. He continued with Mystic and Parkertown Beach Replenishment projects reporting the in water jetty construction and break water construction is complete and in the latter half of March the Contractor will bring in the sand for the beach replenishment and grading.

Mayor Scibetta thanked Mr. Worth for all his hard work and the funding that he has helped bring into the Township.

Township Engineer, Jason Worth stated he is looking into multiple applications for grant funding and they are trying to take advantage of every program that is out there and available for the Township.

PUBLIC COMMENT - Any Topic

Ms. Keenan of West Navinsink Drive representing the Environmental Commission, congratulated Mayor Scibetta, Deputy Mayor Maxwell and Committeeman Laney on their appointments. She further thanked the Township Engineer for all his help with the Environmental Commission. She stated the mission for 2023 is to create a hero recognition program, a program with the elementary school children and requested permission to paint the shed at the community center.

Committeeman Laney stated there is some carpentry work that needs to be done first but they will be painting the shed.

Mr. Edmonds of Spruce Drive provided updates on the Spruce Drive drainage project, Center Street resurfacing and repair project and hiring additional police officers and staff for the betterment of the residents and the community.

Mr. Mooney of Windstar Drive congratulated Mayor Scibetta and Committeeman Laney. He thanked the Committee Members for paving various roads in town but stated Leitz Boulevard and the entrance of Sunrise Bay is still in need of paving. He further requested an update on the street lighting on Radio

Road and thanked the Committee for uploading the feasibility study to the website. He further requested a time frame for road repaying in Sunrise Bay and how the Township determines a time frame for paying.

Mayor Scibetta stated Leitz Boulevard is on the list to be paved in the near future.

Business Administrator, Rodney Haines stated BPU is looking into the Township's complaint and the former employees that were once working on it were no longer employed by the BPU.

Mayor Scibetta provided the public with an explanation and update on the BPU complaint, reach out and progress the town has made at this point. He stated this involves the street lighting on Radio Road in addition to solar on the building.

Township Attorney, Melanie Appleby, furthered explained the process stating it is all very fluid with the BPU and she is working trying to get something done.

Township Engineer, Jason Worth, stated there is no time frame for paving projects and that it depends on the construction and condition of the roadways. He stated typically after twenty years the roads are looked at to see what needs to be done.

Mr. Rizzolo of Kentucky Drive congratulated the Committee Members and asked if the trees will be replaced that were removed for the beach replenishment project. He also questioned if there will be more maintenance at the beaches after the beach replenishments is done. He also asked about a pedestrian walking path along Osbourn Island and Radio Road.

Mayor Scibetta stated he will be speaking with Department of Public Works regarding a process and schedule for maintenance of the beaches once they are completed.

Township Engineer, Jason Worth stated he has spoken with the county trying to make their roadways more pedestrian friendly and they are open to improvements being done although they leave it up to the Municipalities to undertake those projects. He stated they recently made Radio Road a bit smaller with a wider shoulder so a bike lane could possibly be incorporated in the future. He further stated the Township met with the EDA and discussed grant programs and revitalization projects available which could be incorporated in the town.

Mr. Dwyer from Frog Pond Road spoke regarding the speeding in town and requested additional signage, enforcement and awareness on his roadway.

Township Engineer, Jason Worth stated they will be applying for the Safe Routes to School grant although it is not guaranteed that the Township will receive funding from year to year. He further stated he spoke with Public Works regarding the signage and they will be putting up more signage for awareness in addition to looking into other avenues to slow the traffic.

Ms. Bozarth of Tradewind Drive spoke regarding her fence that was removed without notification from Khovnanian contractor during the construction of the Sandpiper development.

Township Engineer, Jason Worth stated he will reach out to the Khovnanian contractor and meet them onsite to discuss the issues that several property owners have with the removal of fences, trees etc. and require a remedy to get the fences re-installed.

Mr. Kuna of Tradewinds Drive stated the original plans showed a fifteen foot buffer zone and he asked if an owner can install a fence in the buffer zone.

Township Engineer, Jason Worth stated the buffer zone is not deed restricted and a fence can be installed by the home owner in the buffer zone.

He further stated he appreciates the residents attending the meeting to provide the Committee with information or issues within the town. He further stated for residents who are looking to report street light outages, they can go online to report them through Atlantic City Electric.
