A. David DeFeo Preliminary and Final Major Site Plan Approval
Application #2022-06
1399 Route 539 a/k/a Block 124, Lot 2 - GB Zone

Kevin Quinlan, Esquire for the applicant. Sworn in Matthew Wilder, applicant's engineer, who provided his background. Marked as Exhibits A-1 & A-2 were aerials of the site. Mr. Wilder provided a summary of the proposed 8,000 sq. ft. one-story building to house an office and warehouse facility for applicant's insulation business. Private will and septic are being proposed. Mr. Wilder reviewed the comments by Remington & Vernick, set forth in their letter dated December 12, 2022. Applicant estimates 7-12 employees, who will come to the site in the morning, leave their personal vehicles and load up a company vehicle with the products needed for their day. Employees may return to the site on occasion during the day for additional supplies if needed. Proposed hours of operation are 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., six days a week. Applicant is proposing a gravel parking area, and would need a waiver for same. There was discussion regarding the positive and negative aspects as to the gravel parking area, and the applicant did agree to pave the parking area. Applicant will also require waivers for an: environmental assessment, traffic impact study and buffer along Parker's Country Road. Taylor Design Group's letter of December 19, 2022 was discussed as to lighting,

design waivers and buffering. Marked as Exhibit A-3 was a color rendering of the proposed metal building. Applicant agreed to have the local fire department review the plan for comments. Trash collection will be done once a week by a private company after 7:00 a.m. and before 7:00 p.m. No outside storage is permitted, except for the parking of company vehicles. The building will not be open to the public as a retail facility. Mr. Brady asked if the applicant would be the only tenant as there are numerous garage doors. Applicant would like the ability to rent our part of the facility in the future. Sworn in applicant, David DeFeo. There was discussion regarding future tenants, location of "man" doors and ADA parking. Mr. Taylor suggested that the applicant speak to the construction official to determine how many "man" doors are required by code. Applicant will work with Mr. Taylor regarding additional tree planting. Mr. Andrew asked if the applicant would be providing an EV parking station, as required by township Ordinance. Mr. Andrew also inquired about signage. Applicant is only proposing a freestanding monument sign, no building signage. It was agreed that if the applicant wanted to rent out any part of the building in the future, he would require amended site plan approval.

On a motion by Mr. Andrew, seconded by Mr. Benn, the application was opened to the public. All aye. There being no public wishing to comment, on a motion by Mr. Andrew, seconded by Mr. Benn, the application was closed to the public. All aye.
