#### TOWNSHIP ENGINEER COMMENTS

Township Engineer, Jason Worth, reported the Ocean County Engineer's Office provided updates of the projects that will be going on in town which included: re-paving Radio Road from Mathistown Road to Great Bay Blvd. with traffic studies being conducted for further improvements; updating the intersection of Oak Lane by installing a right hand turn lane from Oak Lane to Radio Road; and improvements to the parking at Mystic Beach. He also stated bids will be accepted on February 1 for the 2023 Drainage Improvements project and awarded at February's Committee Meeting. He continued by stating the road project application is wrapping up and will hopefully be completed by next week in order to forward to

NJDOT for approval for the Oak Lane project to be awarded in March. He finished by stating the 2024 Recreation Improvement grant information was received today with an application deadline of February 27.

Mayor Scibetta requested that Chief Hawkins inform the Committee and the public on his most recent training with the FBI National Academy.

Chief Hawkins thanked the Committee, support staff and the police department for allowing him the opportunity to participate in the most prestigious leadership law enforcement training with the FBI National Academy. He stated only 1% of law enforcement officers worldwide are accepted for the 11 week training. He continued by stating, it is one of the most honorable things he has done thus far in his career and he is honored that he is able to provide the knowledge and training to learned back to the Police Department and the residents of LEHT.

### PUBLIC COMMENT - Any Topic

Mr. Colandrea of Sandy Court asked if anything can be done about the traffic light behind the Acme Plaza.

Township Engineer Jason Worth stated most of the back-up of traffic currently is from the closing of the Otis Bog Bridge and once the project is complete the traffic should let up. He stated the intersection is controlled by the County but at next month's County meeting he will bring up the issue to see what can be done.

Mayor Scibetta asked if the town received an estimated time of completion from the County on the Otis Bog Bridge Project.

Township Engineer Jason Worth stated he has not received a current time of completion, although according to the County, it is supposed be complete by the end of the month. He stated he will reach out tomorrow to the County to get an estimated completion date.

Mr. Andrew of Maryland Road asked if the check valves will be done on Osborn Island and he further requested that the County fill in the dips off Ohio Road when Radio Road gets repaved.
